The Great Prayer

Matthew 6:9-13

⁹ “This, then, is how you should pray: “Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,
¹⁰ your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. ¹¹ Give us today
our daily bread. ¹² And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors ¹³
And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one.”

Majestic – (Exodus 15:6, 11; Job 37:22; Jude 1:25)

Name above all names – (Philippians 2:9-10)

One and Only Son – (John 1:14; 1:18; 3:16; 1 John 4:9)

Peace – (Isaiah 9:6; Romans 5:1; Colossians 1:20)

Quieter – (Psalm 23:2; Zephaniah 3:17)

Repentance

(forgive us our debts) – take a moment and humbly ask for God’s forgiveness

Matthew 6:14-15

¹⁴ For if you forgive other people when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. ¹⁵ But if you do not forgive others their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins.

Psalm 51

¹ Have mercy on me, O God, according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions. ² Wash away all my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin. ³ For I know my transgressions, and my sin is always before me.

⁴ Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight; so you are right in your verdict and justified when you judge.

Romans 2:5

But because of your stubbornness and your unrepentant heart, you are storing up wrath against yourself for the day of God’s wrath, when his righteous judgment will be revealed.

2 Corinthians 7

⁸ Even if I caused you sorrow by my letter, I do not regret it. Though I did regret it—I see that my letter hurt you, but only for a little while—⁹ yet now I am happy, not because you were made sorry, but because your sorrow led you to repentance. For you became sorrowful as God intended and so were not harmed in any way by us. ¹⁰ Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death. ¹¹ See what this godly sorrow has produced in you: what earnestness, what eagerness to clear yourselves, what indignation, what alarm, what longing, what concern, what readiness to see justice done.

1 John 1:9

⁹ If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.

Ask

(give us this day our daily bread) – take a moment and contemplate how often God commands us to ask

Psalms 18:6 - In my distress I called to the Lord; I cried to my God for help. From His temple He heard my voice; my cry came before Him, into His ears.

Jeremiah 29:12 - Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you.

Matthew 7:7 - "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you.

Matthew 21:22 - Whatever you ask in my name, this I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son.

Mark 11:24 - Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours.

John 14:13 - Whatever you ask in my name, this I will do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son.

Philippians 4:6-7 - Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Ephesians 6:18 – And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people.

1 Timothy 2:1-2 - I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people— for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness.

James 4:2,3 - You do not have because you do not ask God. ³When you ask, you do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives

1 John 5:14 - This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us.

Yield

(thy will be done) – take a moment and prayerfully ask God to move your will to match His
